24-hour urine sample collection (dU-)

Test for which the collection is carried out: _____

Collection container

You can get the collection container from your medical care unit or you can pick it up from the nearest service point of Eastern Finland Laboratory Centre (ISLAB).

Storing

When a urine sample is stored, chemicals or bacteria quickly start multiplying in the sample, which may impact the test results. Therefore the tops of the collection containers must be screwed shut tightly and **the collected sample be stored in cold environment (refrigerator temperature) throughout the sample collection process.**

Start of sample collection

Empty your bladder. Do not collect this sample.

Write down this time, which is the start of the urine sample collection at the same time:

After that, collect all urine into the collection container every time you urinate. Keep the container in a cold place. If one container is not enough, continue collecting into another container.

End of sample collection

Collect the last urine sample exactly 24 hours from the beginning of collection. The collection ends here.

Keep the collection container in a cold place and take it to the laboratory as soon as possible after termination of the sample collection. The container can be taken to the laboratory in room temperature. Take this urine sample collection instruction to the laboratory together with the sample.

Let the person collecting the sample know if you were not able to follow these instructions or if you were given other instructions.

You medical care physician or nurse will answer inquiries concerning testing and test results. The laboratory will answer questions related to sampling procedure.
